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NOW THEREFORE the California Corporations Commissioner ("Commissioner") having
23 found that Dependable Escrow Co. ("Dependable Escrow") failed to timely file its annual audit report
24 containing audited financial statements ("audit report") for its fiscal year ended December 31, 2006
25 as required by Financial Code section 17406, it is hereby ordered, pursuant to Financial Code section
26 17408, that Dependable Escrow pay the Commissioner the sum of \$5,700.00.

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1 Pursuant to Financial Code section 17406, Dependable Escrow was required to submit its
2 audit report for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2006 to the Commissioner on or before April 16,
3 2007.

4 The Commissioner notified Dependable Escrow in writing on or about November 14, 2006 of
5 the due date of the audit report as well as the possibility of the imposition of fines if the audit report
6 was filed late.

7 On or about May 10, 2007, the Commissioner again notified Dependable Escrow in writing of
8 the due date of the audit report and the possibility of the imposition of fines if the audit report was
9 filed late.

10 On or about June 13, 2007, Dependable Escrow filed its audit report with the Commissioner,
11 fifty-seven (57) days after the April 16, 2007 filing deadline.

12 Financial Code section 17408, subdivisions (b) - (e) provide as follows:

13 (b) The commissioner may impose, by order, a penalty on any person who
14 fails, within the time specified in any written demand of the commissioner, (1)
15 to make and file with the commissioner any report required by law or
16 requested by the commissioner . . . The amount of the penalty may not exceed
17 one hundred dollars (\$100) for each day for the first five days the report or
information is overdue, and thereafter may not exceed five hundred dollars
(\$500) for each day the report or information is overdue.

18 (c) If, after an order has been made under subdivision (b), a request for
19 hearing is filed in writing within 30 days of the date of service of the order by
20 the person to whom the order was directed, a hearing shall be held in
21 accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 5 (commencing
with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code,
and the commissioner shall have all the powers granted under that chapter.

22 (d) If the person fails to file a written request for a hearing within 30 days
23 of the date of service of the order, the order imposing the penalty shall be
24 deemed a final order of the commissioner, and the penalty shall be paid within
five business days.

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(e) If a hearing is requested, the penalty shall be paid within five business days after the effective date of any decision in the case ordering payment to be made.
