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22 1. On August 17, 2015, the Commissioner of Business Oversight (Commissioner) issued
23 to EMJ Capital Corporation (EMJ Capital) a finance lender license under the authority of the
24 California Finance Lenders Law (CFLI) (Fin. Code, § 22000 et seq.).

25 2. On December 8, 2015, the Commissioner issued to EMJ Capital an Order Summarily
26 Revoking California Finance Lenders License Pursuant to Financial Code Section 22107 (Order
27 Revoking) effective December 30, 2015, due to EMJ Capital’s failure to pay its 2015-2016 annual
28 assessment.

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3. On May 15, 2017, EMJ Capital filed a written request with the Commissioner petitioning for reinstatement (Petition) of its CFLL license pursuant to Government Code section 11522.

4. On June 27, 2013, the Commissioner issued a Notice of Petition for Reinstatement (Notice) pursuant to Government Code section 11522 and served the Notice on EMJ Capital providing notice that a decision on the Petition would be rendered by August 28, 2017.

5. The Commissioner, having considered the Petition and any written argument and/or documentation, hereby renders the following decision and the reasons therefore:

i. EMJ Capital has failed to provide to the Commissioner a certificate of qualification or good standing from the California Secretary of State in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 10, section 1422.

ii. EMJ Capital’s failure to maintain good standing with the California Secretary of State renders it not qualified for licensure under the CFLL.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Petition is denied.
