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Jan Lynn Owen, the Commissioner of Business Oversight ("Commissioner" or "Complainant") finds that:

- 1. Pacific Hills, LLC ("Pacific Hills") is, and at all relevant times, a California Limited Liability Company founded in 2009 with its principal place of business located at 505 East Ist Street, Suite D, Tustin, California 92780.
- 2. On April 1, 2016, Pacific Hills filed an application for a finance broker license (the "Application") with the Commissioner under the California Finance Lenders Law ("CFLL") (Financial Code, § 22000 et seq.), in particular Financial Code section 22100.
- 3. Dustin Wataru Doi ("Doi") is the president and chief executive officer holding 50 percent ownership of Pacific Hills.
- 4. The Vinh Doan ("Doan") is the vice president holding the other 50 percent ownership of Pacific Hills. Doan will be the person responsible for the conduct of Pacific Hills' lending activity in this state.
- 5. Doan's Statement of Identity and Questionnaire ("SIQ"), Exhibit C to the Application, at Question 5. asked: "Have you ever been convicted of or pleaded nolo contendere to a misdemeanor or felony other than minor traffic citations that do not constitute a misdemeanor or felony offense?" Doan answered "Yes" and provided this detail: "1998 18 years ago when I was 19, I plead guilty to commercial burglary." In that case, Doan was convicted of second degree burglary and grand theft, a felony, and served 16 months in jail and was ordered to pay restitution. But Doan failed to disclose he was also convicted of grand theft on April 28, 2008<sup>1</sup>. For that crime, Doan was sentenced to two years probation and ordered to participate in a work program.
- 6. On August 9, 2016, the Department requested information from Doan concerning the 2008 grand theft conviction. Doan responded that he took three items from a store a USB memory stick, an iPod and an FM charger, without paying for them. The items amounted to \$609.00.
- 7. Under Financial Code section 22109, subdivision (a) (2), the Commissioner may deny the application for a finance lender or broker license if the applicant or an officer, director, general

partner, person responsible for the applicant's lending activities in this state, or person owning or controlling, directly or indirectly, 10 percent or more of the outstanding interests or equity securities of the applicant has, within the last 10 years, been convicted of or pleaded nolo contendere to a crime, or committed an act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit, if the crime or act is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a person engaged in business in accordance with this division.

- 8. Doan's criminal conviction of grand theft within the last 10 years gives the Commissioner cause to deny the finance broker license application of Pacific Hills under section 22109 of the Financial Code.
- 9. On September 19, 2016, the Commissioner issued a Notice of Intent to Deny Application for Finance Broker License, Statement of Issues, and accompanying documents against Pacific Hills based upon the above. Pacific Hills was served with those documents on September 20, 2016 by certified return-receipt mail at the address listed on its application. The Department received the green return-receipt card signed by Doi on September 25, 2016. The Department has received no request for a hearing from Pacific Hills and the time to request a hearing has expired.

NOW GOOD CAUSE APPEARING THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered that the finance lender license application of Pacific Hills is hereby denied. This order is effective as of the date hereof.
