19	The Complainant, the Commissioner of Business Oversight (Commissioner), alleges and	
20	charges Respondent, Michelle Denise Robinson (Robinson), as follows:

22	INTRODUCTION	
23	1. The Commissioner licenses and regulates mortgage loan originators, finance lenders, and	
24	brokers under the California Financing Law (Fin. Code, § 22000 et seq.) (CFL). ¹

- To become licensed by the Commissioner as a mortgage loan originator (MLO), an individual must submit a uniform application form (known as the MU2 or MU4 form) through the Nationwide Mortgage Licensing System & Registry (NLMS).
 On October 18, 2017, Robinson applied to the Department of Business Oversight (DBO) for an MLO license by submitting a Form MU4 through the NMLS.
 Between October 18, 2017 and February 9, 2018, Robinson submitted seven amendments to her Form MU4 through the NMLS.
 The Commissioner intends to issue an order denying Robinson's October 18, 2017
 - The Commissioner intends to issue an order denying Robinson's October 18, 2017 application, as amended, for a MLO license pursuant to Financial Code section 22109.1 because Robinson has been convicted of, or pled guilty or nolo contendere to, a felony in a domestic court and that felony involved an act of fraud, dishonesty, a breach of trust, or money laundering.

II.

ROBINSON'S 1989 THEFT CONVICTION

- 6. On or about June 26, 1989, an Illinois criminal court entered a judgment convicting Robinson of two felonies in that State, namely: theft and theft by deception.
- 7. Theft crimes necessarily involve dishonesty. (*People v. Wheeler* (1992) 4 Cal. 4th 284, 297.)
- 8. Robinson therefore has been convicted of, or pled guilty or nolo contendere to, a felony in a domestic court and that felony involved an act of fraud, dishonesty, a breach of trust, or money laundering, failing to meet the requirement for licensure provided by Financial Code section 22109.1, subdivision (a)(2)(A).

GROUNDS TO DENY ROBINSON'S APPLICATION

III.

9. The CFL requires the Commissioner to deny a mortgage loan originator license unless the Commissioner finds that the applicant has not ever been convicted of a felony involving an act of fraud, dishonesty, a breach of trust, or money laundering. (Fin. Code, § 22109.1, subd. (a)(2)(A).) ///

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CONCLUSION Based on the foregoing, the Commissioner asserts that she is justified under Financial Code section 22109.1 to deny the issuance of a MLO license to Robinson. WHEREFORE, the Commissioner prays that the application for a mortgage loan originator license filed by Michelle Denise Robinson on October 18, 2017, as amended, be denied.
