Petitioner is not entitled to reinstatement of employment, management or control of an escrow agent for the following reasons:

1. Russello states in his petition that he "has previous [sic] worked as an escrow agent for companies that are exempt from From [sic] licensing from [sic] the Commissioner . . . No previous [sic] and/or current complaints are against RUSSELLO." Despite this assertion, Russello fails to name those companies for whom he worked as an escrow agent, the dates of his employment, and the positions he held while so employed. In addition to these omissions of fact, Russello fails to provide any letters of support from his former employers to aid his claim of rehabilitation.

9 2. Russello has attempted no educational training, which would assist in his rehabilitation process, other than what he was absolutely required to undertake to maintain his real 10 estate broker's license. Additionally, the main focus of those courses Russello is required to take in 12 connection with his broker's license concern subjects relating to real estate sales and not issues 13 pertinent to the independent escrow industry, such as escrow processing and handling and accounting 14 of trust funds under the California Escrow Law (Fin. Code, §§ 17000 et seq.) ("Escrow Law"). 15 Russello has not otherwise demonstrated that he will not violate the Escrow Law and/or orders issued 16 thereunder in the future, or that he will possess the technical skills or knowledge of the policies, 17 procedures, and controls necessary to competently be employed with, or manage or control an escrow 18 agent, in compliance with the Escrow Law and/or orders issued thereunder.

19 3. Furthermore, Russello's violations of the Escrow Law, as set forth in the findings of 20 the Administrative Law Judge in the proceedings entitled In the Matter of the Accusation of the 21 Commissioner of Corporations of the State of California v. Christopher Allen Russello, are of such an 22 egregious nature because he was found to have knowingly disbursed or caused the disbursal of trust 23 funds otherwise than in accordance with the escrow instructions in violation of Financial Code 24 section 17414, subdivision (a), knowingly abstracted or misappropriated trust funds in violation of 25 Financial Code section 17414, subdivision (b), and knowingly paid out money from escrow accounts 26 in excess of the credit balance of such escrow accounts in violation of California Code of 27 Regulations, Title 10, section 1738.1, amongst other violations. Russello fails to demonstrate, by 28 way of his petition and written argument, that he no longer poses a threat to the public given his past

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1	misconduct.	
2	4. In light of the foregoing, Russello has offered no evidence to demonstrate that he has	
3	been sufficiently rehabilitated. Moreover, he has failed to show that he is presently capable of	
4	holding a position of employment, management or control of an escrow company.	
5	WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Petition be denied.

 Despite this assertion, Russello fails to name those companies for whom he has worked as an escrow agent, the dates of his employment, and the positions he held while so employed. In addition to these omissions of fact, Russello fails to provide any letters of support from his former employers to aid his claim of rehabilitation. The only proof of rehabilitation Russello offers are his own self-serving statements, including his assertion that he "poses no threat of public safety, [and] therefore Respondent has been completely rehabilitated . . ." Russello fails to provide any independent corroborating evidence in support of his claim of rehabilitation.
