Rather, is providing the technological and customer service support that allows to receive money for transmission in the U.S. Therefore, is not subject to the requirements of the MTA because it is not conducting money transmission. And, as a commercial bank whose deposits are insured by the FDIC, is exempt from the requirements of the MTA. ² This opinion is based solely on the facts as represented in your correspondence, and the Department's understanding of those representations.
