On September 22, 2021, the Commissioner notified the Attorney General of the filing of the Petition and gave the parties until October 27, 2021, to present any written argument or supporting documentation.

The Commissioner, having considered the Petition and arguments of the parties under Government Code section 11522, finds that JMP has presented sufficient evidence showing it has paid its 2019-2020 annual assessment and is otherwise fit to engage in the business of finance lending or brokering.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Petition is granted on the condition that JMP pay a penalty of \$2,500.00 for failing to file its 2019-2020 annual assessment as required by Financial Code section 22107 no later than 14 days after the date of this Order.

The penalty of \$2,500.00 shall be paid by cashier's check or Automated Clearing House deposit made payable to the Department of Financial Protection and Innovation and transmitted to the attention of Accounting – Litigation at the Department of Financial Protection and Innovation, 2101 Arena Boulevard, Sacramento, California 95834.
